Department of Agricultural Economics (DAE)

The DAE is one of the integral parts of the College of Agriculture in implementing the College's main objectives of teaching, research and extension.

At present the DAE has three programs of teaching. These are the diploma, B. Sc. and M. Sc. programs.

The Degree Program (B.Sc.)

This program has been operating since the establishment of the DAE in 1961. The first batch in this program graduated in 1962. Between 1965 and 1985, 475 students graduated in agricultural economics, of whom 10 were foreigners. The Alemayan 1985 class comprises 34 graduates student with MSc degree.

Prior to 1985, with a substantial number of permanent senior staff members, the DAE's Research and Extension activities were satisfactory. But, these activities are very much limited at the moment due to the shortage of senior staff, funds and equipments. The only ongoing research in the DAE at the time of our graduation was the Farming Systems Research (FSR), which was jointly financed by Addis Ababa University and the French Technical Cooperation (Viz. Yali?).
