The Department of Agricultural Engineering was established in October 1960, and since then, there has been considerable expansion of the curriculum.

The main objective of training in the field of Agricultural Engineering is to educate students in Engineering as applied to agriculture. Upon completing their programs, students become qualified to plan, develop, and direct all engineering work in agriculture and agricultural-based industries.

The department has a reasonably equipped workshop to provide basic training in workshop technology.

The department offers 70 credit hours of coursework for majors and 11 credit hours for non-majors.

With regard to research activities, the department undertakes a research project on storage studies for grain in Hararghe Region. The department is involved in testing windmills for irrigation purposes. With further input from staff and facilities, the department plays a crucial role in the development of agriculture and the improvement of the farming community.
